



PARTICIPANT COMMITMENT STATEMENT

Upon acceptance as a participant in REAL Montana, I understand and agree to the following:

1. I have reviewed the REAL Montana expectation and conduct handbook and will adhere to these policies.
2. I am expected to fully attend all seminars, including the international trip, and have reviewed the seminar dates to make necessary scheduling arrangements. If a situation occurs that prevents my attendance at any REAL Montana function, I will directly contact the Program Director as soon as possible.
3. REAL Montana incurs significant costs in arranging tours, speakers, lodging, meals, and transportation. Accordingly, I understand that any unexcused absences or inappropriate actions are considered detrimental to the program and will be dealt with on a case-by-case basis by the REAL Montana Advisory Board, and may result in removal from the program.
4. I am expected to arrive at each seminar with an open and inquiring mind, a willingness to learn, and a respectful attitude towards the opinions of others.
5. I am expected to complete all seminar assignments and program evaluations within the timeframe specified by the Program Director.
6. I am expected to pay a tuition fee of \$3,000 which covers seminar costs including tours, educational materials, lodging, meals, and out-of-state travel. Payment will be due in two installments at the start of Year One and Year Two. I understand that participants are encouraged to individually seek scholarships from employers and/or industry organizations to offset the tuition fee.
7. I am expected to secure the necessary time away from my place of employment to attend all seminars. I am also expected to arrange all travel to and from each in-state seminar as well as the departure locations for the national and international seminars.
8. **Upon graduation from REAL Montana, I am expected to utilize my training to be an active leader on behalf of the natural resource industries and my community.**
